Loving God's Word

How do we love God's Word? We sing, "O how I love Jesus, O how I love Jesus; O how I love Jesus, because he first loved me." But how well do we love His word? **John 14:15** states, "If you love me, you will keep my commandments." So, do we really love Jesus?

As I challenged us at the beginning of the year to read through the Bible in a year, many of you took up that challenge (it's not too late to jump on). I took the challenge and have made it ½ way through the year now (crazy challenge for me as this is the first time, I have done this). The Bible Reading, I am using has taken me to Psalm 119. An extremely long Psalm, but packed with such truth. As you read through it you can see the love the Psalmist has for God's Word.

Here are a few examples:

- "With all my heart I seek you. Do not allow me to stray from your commands (v.10)"
- "I find delight in your statues; I do not forget your instructions. (v.16)"
- "I desperately long to know your regulations at all times. (v.20)
- "Yes, I find delight in your rules; they give me guidance. (v.24)"
- "I will speak about your regulations before kings and not be ashamed. I will find delight in your commands which I love. I will lift my hands to your commands, which I love, and I will mediate on your statues. (v.46 48)"
- "I find hope in your word. (v.147)"

These are but a few of the praises the Psalmist gives to God's Word. It is his life, his hope, his salvation. Do we see God's Word that way? Do we long for it, do we crave it, do we feel empty when we have been away from it for a time?

John 20:31 states, "but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name." These things were written (the Bible) that we may believe in Christ and in believing we will have life with Him. Christians, I encourage you let us long for God's Word as deeply as we long to get to Heaven. Let us love His word as deeply as we love Him. For to love Christ, is to keep His commandments.
