As I have been reading various Books of the Bible, some for personal study and others preparing for future church studies. I have had to stop at **Ecclesiastes 12:13 – 14**, which states, "The end of the matter, all that has been heard: fear God and keep His commandments, because this is the end of the matter for mankind.
