We have started a New Year and some exciting things have been happening here at Columbia. I would like a minute of your time to let you know what's been happening and to ask for your help. Now that sounds like an advertisement letter.

Well anyway, for the past two months the **Youth Group** has been gaining momentum. We started by making Wednesday Nights solely youth, changed up the worship and introduced Memory Verses.
